



Patrick E. Brown has worked in and with New York State Government since graduating summa cum laude from Pace University Law School in 1983. Pat started his legal career at the New York Court of Appeals, the state's highest court, where he served on the Court's legal staff from 1983-85 and as Chief Law Assistant from 1985-87. Pat's government service culminated in his work for Governor Mario M. Cuomo: first as an Assistant Counsel where he worked on commercial and consumer issues and the Governor's election reform agenda and then as First Assistant Counsel to the Governor from 1990-1993 where he assisted the Counsel in managing the

Council's Office. During 1994, Pat served as Director of Industry and Community Relations at the Department of Economic Development, where he was the Governor's chief advisor on horseracing and gaming issues and the State's lead negotiator with New York Indian Tribes and Nations. After leaving state service, Pat was a partner at Plunkett & Jaffe, P.C. from 1995-2001. A proud product of the SUNY system (Oneonta, 1978), Pat was appointed to the SUNY Oneonta College Council by Governor Elliot Spitzer in January 2008 and later that year he was appointed Chair of the Council by Governor David Paterson. Pat has been a member of the Town of Coeymans Zoning Board of Appeals since 1998 and is a founding Board member of Grassroot Givers, a Capital District charity. Pat lives in southern Albany County with his wife Mary, three daughters and an English bulldog, Winston.
